Instructions for completing the Nitrate Monitoring Report

1. **Using a nitrate test kit, routinely monitor the nitrate level at a tap located after the water treatment system. Monitoring should be conducted no less than once per week.**
2. Record the time the sample was taken, the nitrate concentration, and the sample location.
3. Record the water meter reading at the time of sampling.
4. Record the name of the person who analyzed the sample.
5. If the sample exceeds 10 mg/L, contact the Minnesota Department of Health (MDH) at 651/201-4700 by the end of the business day. Your water treatment vendor should also be contacted to verify proper operation of the treatment equipment.

Keep a copy of the completed form on-site and available for review by MDH for a period of no less than three years.
